Serving as an officer in the United States Air Force and Air Force Reserve, and being a professor at universities in the United States and overseas, Heath Daniels' lifelong fascination with international politics and intrigue grew stronger. Four-years working at universities in the Middle East gave him an opportunity to better understand Muslim culture both abroad and in the United States. It also gave him the plotline for his first novel *THREE KISSES*, about Islamic terrorists infiltrating the United States.

Daniels recently released his second novel *DAY OF JUDGMENT*, an action-packed adventure which reveals the harsh reality of what it means to live as an Arab in American when the scales of justice are often stacked against you. Filled with international terrorism at the hands of those whose Muslim and Islamic fronts hide their true desires, this novel asks whether there is justice in America.

“Living in Muslim-majority countries gave me much closer exposure to Islam and that gave me insight about Islam in the United States,” said Daniels. “I wrote the books in such a way that would deepen understanding of complex relationships, both politically and personally.” He says his books have been influenced by his military service and four years living in Lebanon and Turkey, but also by his love of John Grisham books. “Grisham takes characters and locations that are very ordinary on the surface and slowly reveals layers of complexity in them and their situations,” says Daniels. “There are a fair amount of military characters in my books and I try to show the many facets of the armed forces, from those who see themselves as servants to the nation to the few who abuse their power.”
